Fireworks Show Guidance June 18, 2020

As we prepare to celebrate Independence Day amidst the challenges of the COVID-19 pandemic, Sacramento County Public Health is issuing the following guidance for fireworks shows. In accordance with the California Department of Public Health, fireworks shows are permissible only when attendees remain in their vehicles. Fireworks show organizers and attendees are advised to adhere to the following guidance to ensure a safe and healthy Fourth of July celebration.

- Vehicles must be spaced at least six feet apart.
- Each vehicle may only be occupied by members of the same household who have already been in close contact with each other. If not utilizing restroom facilities or picking up concessions, patrons must remain in their vehicles. Patrons cannot sit outside of their vehicles to view the show.
- If restrooms are onsite, there must be sufficient handwashing stations and they must be cleaned and sanitized frequently.
- If concessions are provided, cashless and touchless transactions systems are preferred wherever possible. Concessions should be ordered online or over the phone, if possible, and be available for pick-up. Attendees and staff should wear face coverings for all interactions where physical distancing is not possible.
- Organizers should ensure that customers maintain proper physical distancing when waiting for concessions or restrooms.
- Any playgrounds, outdoor eating areas, picnic tables, or other amenities at the show site should be closed. All attendees must remain in their vehicle for the entire time they are at the show site except to use restrooms or purchase concessions, if available.

In the event that the California Department of Public Health issues fireworks show guidance, this guidance may be modified accordingly. Thank you for celebrating safely.
